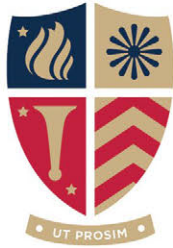


Federation of Boarding Schools

Who will it suit?

Set in an idyllic and safe island just off the South Coast of England, Ryde School provides excellent educational opportunities in a nurturing environment. Sailing is a big focus but also hockey, rugby, netball & cricket, with golf, and yoga with mindfulness, as recent additions. Music is also a big feature at the school and many students go on to develop professional careers in this area. Drama and art are also well-supported. Drama students pursue LAMDA exams to a high level and there are many opportunities to exhibit artwork.

Outcomes

Students have excellent results at GCSE, A level and IB with many going on to Oxbridge and other Russell Group universities as well as art, music and drama colleges.

Settling-In

Boarding houses are positioned in 100 acres of private grounds away from the main school, allowing students to make the distinction between school and home. The Hovercraft and Catamaran are close by, providing good transport links to Portsmouth and London when required. Friends are made from around the world and they make the effort to stay in touch with each other when they have moved on from school.

ASIS View

The students are cheerful and well prepared for the changing needs of a global society. The School encourages spiritual reflection and meditation and students develop a good sense of integrity. Extra-curricular activities are superb and life is lived to the full in many different areas. Poetry and art thrive here.

Who will it suit?

All students who wish to achieve academic prowess alongside the possibility of some impressive extra-curricular activities. The school has its own Equestrian Centre offering riding lessons at all levels and serious riders may study for British Horse Society exams. The sports facilities include a heated indoor pool, a large sports hall with fitness suite and trampolines, an astro-turf pitch, a cricket pitch and extensive playing fields. The Alkins School of Dance offers recreational dance lessons to all students and vocational and BTEC options for those serious about their dance and musical theatre studies.

Outcomes

Students go on to courses including Maths, Computer Science, Politics, Law, Medicine, Nutrition and Animation at top universities worldwide as well as courses at the London Studio Centre.

Settling-In

The school has launched, for September 2015, an international boarding school for boys from the age of 16 with the possibility of a year's foundation course beforehand. The school is on a 53 acre site in a beautiful rural location and actively promotes internationalism as it believes diversity and exposure to different cultures and languages produce global leaders of the future.

ASIS View

The school was founded by the Victorian philanthropist, Nathaniel Woodward and morality and spirituality are at the core of the school's values. The students are happy and respectful of one another and make the most of the amazing facilities. The environment is one of care and nurturing and although the school is set in the countryside, its central location makes the rich cultural experience of the city of Birmingham easily available.

Who will it suit?

Pupils and parents who are not concerned about where a school sits in “performance league tables”, but who value a deeply caring environment for a youngster who might struggle in a highly academic environment. Ideal for those who want to pursue engineering, agriculture, the hospitality industry, product design and art, rather than a purely academic route. There is a wide cultural mix amongst the 192 students. Class sizes are small. London Heathrow is only 2 hours away and Birmingham 45 minutes.

Outcomes

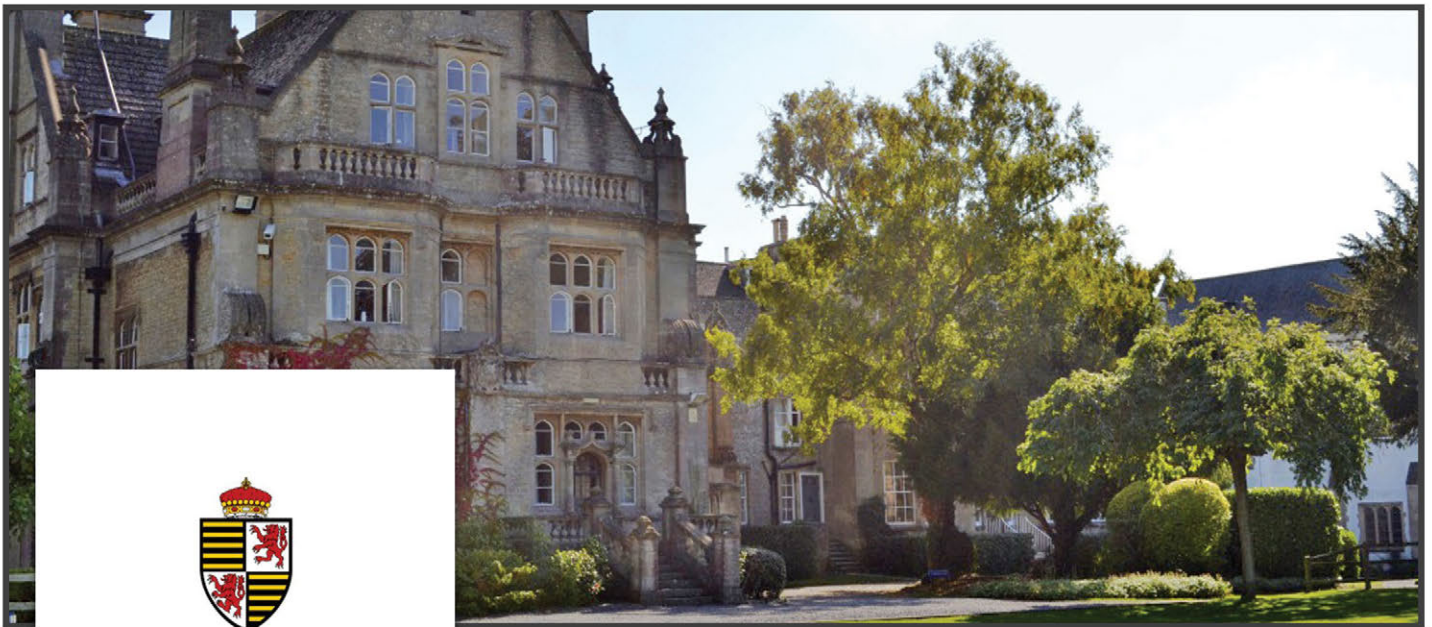
Most move towards vocational colleges or to study practical courses at specialist universities. Apprenticeships also possible.

Settling-In

The 100 boarders are in small dorms made extremely welcoming by the pupils themselves. The school often offers short “trial” periods – a few weeks to a full term or two – and provides speech therapy and language help where needed. For those who want, there are opportunities to help out on the school farm, ride the horses, and care for the machinery and cattle. Sports are mainly minority activities and unusual for schools, such as clay-pigeon shooting. Headmaster has a strong understanding of the learning needs of his pupils.

ASIS View

Set in beautiful countryside with a farm, which breeds pigs, sheep and cattle as an integral aspect of the education for those who want it. Bredon specialises in assisting pupils with learning difficulties, such as dyslexia, dyspraxia and dyscalculia. (The school, however, does not accept pupils with behavioural difficulties). It also offers a range of other vocational approaches, as well as the standard UK GCSE, B-Tech and A-Level curriculums for its non-selective intake.

Who will it suit?

The 200 boarders – about half the senior school population – live in family-type houses with strong pastoral care and obvious familial warmth. There are slightly more boys than girls, most from well-off families, with learning in small class sizes at the Sixth Form level. Excellent sporting facilities, including cricket, tennis, volleyball, lacrosse. Close to the ancient city of Bath and weekend outings are regularly arranged.

Outcomes

Nearly all move on to top UK universities with strong applications to Oxford and Cambridge on an annual basis. Regular and careful mentoring of candidates also ensures alternative destinations, such as apprenticeships, if that is more appropriate. Strong emphasis given to achieving high academic grades to ensure entry into elite universities in UK or abroad.

Settling-In

School offers a G-mail account to all its pupils to ensure there are no gaps in the academic work or understanding of requirements. Strong and positive boarding experience will ensure that those with moderate English language skills quickly upgrade their abilities. School occupies beautiful traditional and modern buildings on both sides of the main road; facilities offer everything an ambitious pupil could want.

ASIS View

Warminster is one of two schools in the ASIS Federation offering the International Baccalaureate (IB) with the option of taking A-levels. A strongly academic and traditional school with a 300 year history and close ties to the armed forces, caring for many sons and daughters of service personnel, plus “high-achievers” from families covering 26 nationalities. Headmaster formerly served in the military and is very modest about his extraordinary achievement of rowing across the Atlantic ocean – twice!

Who will it suit?

Ellesmere is proud of the way it looks after its international community, with children from 30 different countries represented on the school roll. In most classes, however, overseas students are taught alongside local youngsters, ensuring a strong cultural familiarisation for the visitors. This is a school for all-rounders and strength of personality and character development are important. An over-riding factor is the pupil's willingness to "have a go" and participate in the wide range of extra-curricular activities. An impressive artistic and cultural development programme, including tours to the USA every other year, allows those gifted with music, drama and drawing and painting talents to fully unfold their gifts.

Outcomes

Most will go onto elite universities or drama and artistic colleges. The school's sporting strength provides a gateway for professional careers with individuals "scouted" by big clubs and societies.

Settling-In

There is a Foundation Pre-Sixth form course for those without strong English or learning skills, but those joining the Higher level of this course will find most of their studies are alongside pupils from the UK. An international co-ordinator has a special responsibility for the care of overseas pupils, but the strong pastoral support through each Boarding House is a feature of school life, as highlighted in recent government inspection reports.

ASIS View

Founded by Canon Nathaniel Woodard in 1884, the college plays a leading part in the Woodard group of schools. Set in 144 acres, including a nine-hole golf course, the strong academic performance is matched by sporting achievements, with youngsters in several sports achieving national team status. The Head is one of the most experienced in the UK, in post for 18 years. Although non-academically selective, the results are impressive, with 50% of A-level passes at the top grades. IB courses are available, along with GCSE and A-level route.

Who will it suit?

Particularly appropriate for youngsters aged 11 upwards who want to get an international experience close to London. Around 400 seniors (11-18) and 300 juniors allowing caring staff to know each pupil and provide for their needs. Strong on basketball with great new swimming pool used for competitive racing. Ethos features concepts of truth and justice and the value of every person. Wide spread of interests covered by adaptive curriculum, and personalised learning courses made available for those who need it.

Outcomes

Most go to universities or vocational colleges appropriate to pupil's interests. Many overseas pupils are attending Farringtons because their elder siblings did so well there and went on to higher education success in the UK.

Settling-In

School provides a personalised learning course for international students to help with both English learning and development of study skills. Boarding houses staffed by caring 'mother'-type figures who clearly take a close interest in the welfare of each youngster. Extensive grounds allow for sports and games and frequent weekend supervised trips into nearby London greatly appreciated by the boarding community.

ASIS View

One of the ASIS schools closest to London in the county of Kent taking in a wide academic ability and focussing on holistic growth. Christian principles (Methodist) practised but by no means a 'heavy' part of school life or curriculum, which is deliberately wide to cater for mixed abilities. Strong support for weaker English speakers. Wide ethnic and cultural mix within the 70-strong boarding community of the senior school. Good results from a non-selective pupil intake.

Science and maths are strong, but so too are the humanities, and attending chapel – where all faiths are acknowledged – gives a spiritual ambience to the academic and social ambitions of the pupils.

Outcomes

Most move on to top UK universities with strong applications to Oxford and Cambridge on an annual basis. Strong emphasis given to achieving your best, no matter what your academic baseline. Excellent engineering, art, drama and design technology prepares youngsters for vocational programmes if required.

Settling-In

Youngsters report strong bonding and support of each other; 'buddy' systems emerge and highly attentive boarding staff move pupils around in order to ensure they are settled quickly and happily. Facilities are excellent. School also prepared to consider taking international pupils for "taster" programmes, from a few weeks in duration up to one year. Help given to improve English, but immersion with local children the most effective.

ASIS View

A top-class school achieving high academic results, strong sporting success– especially cricket and rugby amongst nine different sports and wide cultural awareness through its Christian foundation, which is at the core of the school's traditional values. Facilities are excellent and the spirit across the extensive campus is of personal growth and freedom within a gently-structured environment. The school has a mix of boarders and day pupils, and integrates both into one community by offering day-pupils 'space' in each of the school houses.

Who will it suit?

Those who flourish in a happy atmosphere where learning is known to take place as much on the sports pitch as in the classroom. For those not inclined towards higher academic achievement, other programmes are available, including studying for B-Tech qualifications in sport and public services. An investment programme of over £7m, including the development of a new sixth form centre and media studies department, has created a warm but non-stressed environment for the 500 pupils.

Outcomes

Many move on to university but a number of pupils are identified by sports groups and leading clubs for higher performance opportunities. Regular overseas touring by sports teams boosts confidence and considerable support is available to find vocational opportunities for those who want them. The Polo Academy coaching, which is an added cost, is attracting attention from around the world.

Settling-In

Opportunities exist for trial periods at the school and the spacious accommodation allows for each age group to feel at home. Big-hearted staff, who are clearly motivated to ensure the best environment for the 110 boarders, create a strong family atmosphere where robust youngsters can discover their own abilities and joys.

ASIS View

Strong sporting links with UK premier league football and rugby teams, plus their own Polo Team and golf course, allow full use to be made of this 'Capability Brown' designed 100-acre estate, set in the heartland of East Anglia. An academically non-selective school, it offers one-to-one help for slower learners and those with special academic needs. Eighty different extra-curricular activities are available each week to complement the traditional GCSE, B-Tech and A-level programmes.

Who will it suit?

Parents and students looking for a traditionally British education as only 10% of the 270 boarders are from international destinations. A further 10% of the school population are day pupils. The school runs an International Study Centre on the same site, offering preparation courses for GCSE and A-Level candidates, as well as induction courses for their parents.

Outcomes

Most move on to top UK universities, including Oxford and Cambridge. In addition to those pursuing the sciences, a strong business-orientation is encouraged with an Enterprise Centre run by the girls, reaching commercial standards. Watch out for women in top positions putting Moreton Hall alumni on their CV.

Settling-In

Care is taken to ensure that candidates quickly lift their academic studies to the appropriate level – they need to be able to demonstrate an ability to cope well with the English language and academic work. For those who require more assistance, the co-ed International Study Centre is recommended. Girls can join academic classes from the Study Centre and the boys there are helped to prepare for other UK schools. The plan is shortly to double capacity to over 40 pupils.

ASIS View

The only all-girls school in the ASIS Federation, Moreton Hall regularly achieves league-table positions in the top 50 of all UK schools. Its Headmaster is a strong advocate of single-sex education and the school recently celebrated its 100th anniversary, one of the few remaining all-girls UK schools to do so. Around 60% of the girls at A-level, study the sciences. Considerable investment on their glorious country site has provided them with outstanding study facilities.

Who will it suit?

Small class sizes allow pupils of mixed-academic ability to find their own strengths. It is expected that each student will join at least two club or 'society' activities per week and make good use of the daily 90 minutes set aside at lunchtime for this purpose. The school is proud of its ability to adapt flexibly to meet pupil's needs in their study of traditional GCSE and A-level programmes, while there is clearly strength in art, textiles and excellent computer-aided design facilities.

Outcomes

Most move on to top UK universities with a strong contingent annually being placed at London's leading art and design colleges. The School has strong links with both leading universities and those that focus on specialist disciplines.

Settling-In

A one-year International GCSE is available for those who are academically capable, but much time and considerable care is given to allowing all international pupils to find their feet, both academically and socially. The school enjoys the benefits of distance from major city conurbations, but is close enough to both countryside and local town to make pupils feel connected to an English country-life community. It follows no 'mould', and very much allows pupils to be themselves.

ASIS View

Sited close to some of Britain's most historical battles, this 600-year-old school has a strong international pupil-body who clearly enjoy the homely, rather quirky English country outlook to their education, which delivers a warm community-feeling through close personal care by teachers. More than 90% of the 145 boarders in this 420 pupil school are from overseas, and modern teaching and boarding facilities make them feel welcome and at home.

Who will it suit?

The smallest ASIS school – just over 110 students – it provides strong language learning in academic disciplines. There are few formalities – teachers and pupils are on first name terms, no bells and no uniform. College Principal – who is bi-lingual and experienced internationally – aims to let all pupils “be who you are”. College recognises that international students sometimes have different requirements and sets out to meet them.

Outcomes

Most students go onto top UK and international universities – there is strength in the sciences, maths and arts. Students undertake IGCSE, GCSE and A-levels, plus additional English language qualifications. The college ensures that every student reaches the English benchmarks required by universities.

Settling-In

The college is flexible with short and long-term courses on offer, including a year-long Business Foundation Course for 17-year-olds covering IT, finance, business and law. Where a student is capable of achieving higher academic success, the very small class sizes and close personal attention from teachers lets this happen quickly.

ASIS View

It is the only fully international college— 90% are boarders, with more than 20 different nationalities. Situated near Reading (a short journey from Heathrow airport), it is ideally located for its cosmopolitan community. Very strong individual academic care and excellent academic and artistic results achieved. Founders wanted it to replicate the Oxford model of compatible students learning together in small tutor groups. A well-bonded community spirit is clearly evident, encouraging international understanding and harmony.

Recent investment in new IT facilities and strong academic support in that area have given an added boost to those students wanting to pursue computer and maths based studies.

Settling-In

Younger students are closely cared for by an enthusiastic and experienced group of boarding house parents. As the youngsters mature, more freedoms are given to allow a sense of independence and responsibility to emerge. Rendcomb has a strong house and tutor system which ensures that pupils receive the appropriate support where necessary to enable them to develop into an adult who is confident, tolerant and caring.

ASIS View

Set in beautiful English parkland in the Cotswolds, this former country house, owned by one of the UK's most benevolent educational philanthropists, is home to around 400 international and UK students who achieve very good academic results in an atmosphere encouraging responsibility and independence. The centenary of the School is just a few years away and it thrives, delivering the Founder's vision of educating the whole child.

Who will it suit?

An innovative and inspiring intellectual curiosity programme, plus excellent help for those with learning needs, has led Rishworth School to be declared as "outstanding" by the leading United Kingdom school inspection authorities. The aim is that every child is lifted to do their very best and as a result the school is one of the UK's top 25 for adding value to a youngster's educational capacity. A strong sports development programme has seen Rishworth pupils go on to represent England, Scotland and Wales in rugby, fencing, volleyball and swimming.
